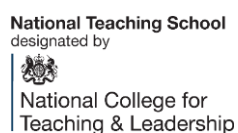
I hope that you have had a lovely half-term break and enjoyed the sunny weather this weekend.

ARTSMARK GOLD CELEBRATION

I am delighted to announce that we have been awarded Artsmark Gold Award again by the Arts Council for our commitment to providing an arts-rich curriculum and enriched cultural learning opportunities for all of our pupils. The Artsmark assessment process is rigorous and so receiving such a prestigious reward for our school is an amazing achievement!

SCHOOL GROUNDS

We have been developing our school grounds over the past few months with the help of the children. From our Bee Enrichment Day the children created recycled bee models which now decorate the fencing along the end of the school field. Children in year 5 worked with a local ceramic artist to create pottery leaves that have been attached to the gate of the tree nursery. Children in years 3 and 4 spent time with a mosaic artist to create minibeast mosaic masterpieces that now adorn the picket fencing by the forest school area and the playground. We are also in the process of creating quiet reflection areas in which we include children's artwork.

We are currently developing the area in the corner of the field, which was previously our vegetable garden into a bee-friendly wildlife garden complete with wildflowers, fruit trees, birdboxes, bug houses, and a bee hotel. We are also transforming our disused polytunnel into an outdoor learning space that can be used by groups of children. Children in year 5 did an amazing job before half term clearing and organising the space. We would welcome any donations of the following items – bird boxes, waxed table cloth, bunting, logs to make a log circle, and wildflower plants.
